UNIVERSITY OF LOUISIANA LAFAYETTE



After receiving solid state funding for several years, colleges and universities were directed to cut their budgets in fiscal year 2008–'09. The reductions challenged the University of Louisiana at Lafayette to reexamine its priorities. That reassessment sharpened our focus even more. We remain steadfast in our belief that we must, above all, protect our core academic mission and continue to provide quality educational opportunities for our students.

Those budget cuts, along with subsequent reductions at the beginning of fiscal year 2009–'10 and again at mid-year in December, underscore the importance of private gifts. We appreciate the generosity of donors whose names are included in this annual Report on Philanthropy.

In many cases, donors' gifts are matched by the state Board of Regents Support Fund to create endowed chairs, endowed professorships and endowed scholarships. Endowed funds are invested; only earned interest is used. So the principal remains a source of perpetual funding for salary supplements that are used to attract and retain exceptional faculty members and for scholarships awarded to deserving students.

Throughout the past year, UL Lafayette faculty and students showed they are worthy of all of the support we can offer. In October, for example, an extraordinary group of architecture, engineering and business administration students and faculty members went to Washington, D.C., to compete in the U.S. Department of Energy's Solar Decathlon. UL Lafayette was one of only 20 universities from around the world chosen to design and build solar homes that were displayed on the National Mall. Its Team BeauSoleil stood shoulder-to-shoulder with teams from universities such as Cornell, the University of Madrid and Ohio State. The BeauSoleil Louisiana Solar Home earned two major awards during the Solar Decathlon: the first-place Market Viability Award and the People's Choice Award. National and international media coverage of the event accurately conveyed that UL Lafayette students and faculty are smart, disciplined and determined.

Also in October, U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan cited Louisiana as the only state in the country that tracks the effectiveness of its teacher preparation programs. He praised UL Lafayette specifically for including student test scores in its evaluations of its College of Education graduates. Within weeks, Washington Post and National Public Radio reporters were on our campus to learn more about our success.

So, we thank every donor whose support has enabled UL Lafayette to continue to excel. We are grateful for every gift.

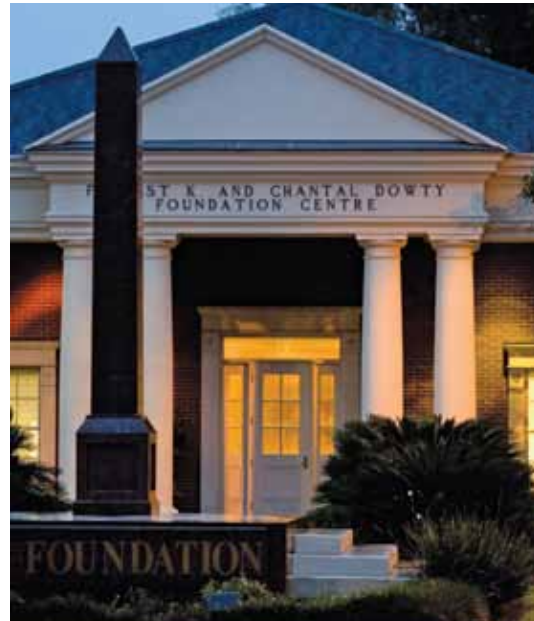
UL LAFAYETTE FOUNDATION 2009 – 2011

Just about every program, department and organization on the campus of the University of Louisiana Lafayette has been effected in some way by the UL Lafayette Foundation. A student is able to follow their dream of studying music because of a scholarship received. A professor is able to research the latest in technology because of a professorship he or she was awarded. A group of students is able to compete in a national competition because of funds raised through the Foundation. There are countless stories found all around campus that can be told.

These stories are able to unfold because of generous donors that selflessly give in order to take our University to the next level. Donors like Col. Philip and Jean Piccione who have established six professorships and are on their way to creating a million dollar chair in Statistics. Or businesses like Cox and Coca-Cola Bottling Company who have generous corporate sponsorships with the Athletic Department. Plaques line the wall commemorating each donation. At the 2009 Distinguished Donor Reception, we were able to induct seven members into the Hall of Honor, which brings the total plaques to 292. Through the Athletic Department and University Art Museum Walls of Honor and the Alumni Association Walk of Honor, the University is able to recognize the generosity of our donors all across campus.

Another way we recognize our donors is through the Honor Roll. The UL Lafayette Foundation's Honor Roll is an annual program that enables the Foundation to generate unrestricted gifts. Gifts are primarily used for operational expenses, development efforts, publications and to respond to the University's needs not met by state funding. Those who become members of the Honor Roll are eligible for consideration onto the Foundation's Board of Trustees.

With ever increasing budget and economic concern, private giving is a crucial component to keep our University moving towards excellence. Our donors are incredibly generous and genuinely care about seeing the University prosper and grow. We truly appreciate your support.

JANUARY – APRIL

A new Executive Institute was unveiled at the B.I. Moody III College of Business Administration. The 12-week leadership program offers continuing education opportunities for the business community. The institute is a brainchild of the Dean of the School of Business, Dr. Joby John. The Training Source, a Lafayette company, partnered with the University to create the institute.

- The College of Nursing and Allied Health Professions received Nursing School of the Year designation during the Nightingale Awards program. The nursing department, which is one of the largest in the country, boasts a 97 percent pass rate for its undergraduate students taking the national licensure exam for the first time. It has maintained this high rate for over 20 years.
- Schlumberger, the world's leading Oilfield Service Company, made a historic \$17.5 million software donation to the University. Their gift allows students and researchers at UL Lafayette to have access to the same exploration and production modeling software used by the oil and gas industry.
- BeauSoleil officially began construction on their solar home for competition in the 2009 Solar Decathlon in Washington, D.C. BeauSoleil was one of 20 teams competing in the worldwide Decathlon to build, design and operate the most attractive and energy-efficient solar powered home.
- The University hosted its first ever Academic Signing Day at St. Thomas More High School and Catholic High School in New Iberia. Over 40 graduating seniors from STM and 14 seniors from CHS signed a "letter of intent" to attend the University. The 42 STM students earned scholarships totaling \$156,000.
- The Pride of Acadiana Marching Band traveled to London, England to perform concerts in the Ross Amphitheatre at the historic Edinburgh Castle and Embankment Gardens Park.
- An economic impact study shows that UL Lafayette is a significant force in the economies of Lafayette, Acadiana and Louisiana. Its spending impact in Louisiana alone is \$755 million annually, with \$726 million of that impacting Acadiana. In addition, the University reported \$51 million in external research funding from state, federal, private and self-generated funds in 2008. Every dollar of state funding invested in UL Lafayette generates more than an \$8 return.

MAY – AUGUST

The future of the University property known as the "Horse Farm" was decided when the Community Foundation of Acadiana announced plans to purchase the property at \$5.7 million. With the sale, the nearly 100-acre Horse Farm will become a passive public park filled with walking trails, bike paths, gardens and green space.

- The Student Government Association surprised the BeauSoleil team with a check for \$50,000. The team thought the SGA would be

presenting a check for \$10,000, but through the generosity of students they were able to give five times that amount.

- Plans to implement state budget cuts were announced. UL Lafayette's state budget was cut by \$4.3 million in January along with an additional \$7.5 million cut following the legislative session that ended in June. The plan calls for freezing vacant positions, reducing economic development investments, implementing a ten percent adjustment to each college's and department's operating budget, reducing maintenance projects and eliminating across the board merit increases.

SEPTEMBER – DECEMBER

The University and the community lost two longstanding professors, Dr. Patricia K. Rickels and Bradley H. Pollock. Dr. Pat, as she was affectionately known around campus, joined the University in 1957. She was professor emeritus of English and director of the Honors Program. She retired in 2007 after 50 years of service. An accomplished scholar and writer, Dr. Pat was also active outside of the classroom. She and her husband Milton were named Louisiana Humanists of the Year in 1990 and was Humanitarian of the Year in 1975. Bradley Pollock joined the faculty in 1984 and played a vital role in the Department of History and Geography. Professor Pollock dedicated his professional career to the discussion and consideration of minority affairs and the importance of African American cultures in the U.S. Memorial funds have been set up for Dr. Patricia Rickels and Bradley Pollock at the UL Lafayette Foundation.

- The B.I. Moody III College of Business Administration is among the best places to receive an MBA, according to The Princeton Review's list of "Best 301 Business Schools." The compilation is based on surveys of 19,000 students enrolled in business schools across the country and on school-reported data.
- The University received approval to request proposals that would outline a master plan for the housing situation on campus. The comprehensive on-campus housing assessment would include master residential plans for the renovation of existing residence halls and the construction of new housing halls. The goal is to house up to 5,000 students, graduate students, faculty, staff and their families.
- For the second year in a row, the 220 members of the Pride of Acadiana Marching Band took the field for pre-game ceremonies and halftime of a New Orleans Saints game.
- A new course at UL Lafayette, the "Cajun Connection," designed for first-time freshman, was piloted in six classes during the fall 2009 semester. The course is designed to help students achieve greater academic success and prepare them for life after college. Over the next five years, the course will be added to the curricula of each college.
- After nearly two years

of preparation, BeauSoleil competed in the 2009 Solar Decathlon. The team came home with two significant first place finishes, winning the Peoples Choice Award and first place in Market Viability.

- The play *Noises Off* became the first production performed at the newly renovated Burke Hall Theatre. The theatre went through multi-million dollar renovations, unveiling new costume and scenic shops, green room, dressing and makeup rooms, a state-of-the-art lighting system and stadium style seating. A fundraising campaign, "Take a Seat" began to upgrade the theatre's seating.
- Jazzman's Coffee Shop became the first addition to the new "learning commons" at Edith Garland Dupre Library. The coffee shop is part of a plan to transform the first floor of the library to better accommodate student needs.
- Ray P. Authement was named President Emeritus of UL Lafayette by the Board of Supervisors for the University of Louisiana System. Under Authement's leadership, the University became a major economic force in Acadiana, while earning a national reputation in the fields of computer science, environmental and biological research, and Francophone studies. Authement retired in 2008 after serving 34 years as president.
- U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan commended UL Lafayette's teaching program in a speech at Columbia University's Teacher's college. His comments brought national attention to the University when reporters with both the Washington Post and National Public Radio met with UL Lafayette officials about teacher preparation.

JANUARY – APRIL

Dr. Devesh Misra, professor of chemical engineering, received a patent for using nanotechnology to precisely deliver medicine to a specific site in a patient's body. This technology could be used to target cancerous tumors. Dr. Misra was one of the recipients of the UL Lafayette Foundation's highest honor awarded to educators — the Distinguished Professor Award. • The University received three awards of funds from the Corporation for National and Community Service: the RUNbus Project under the direction of Dr. Barbara Benson of the Renewable Resources Department; Environmental Awareness Service Projects for Low Income Homes under the direction of Dr. G.H. Massiha of the Industrial Technology Department; and the Chemical Car as a Tool for the Promotion of Math and Science under the direction of Dr. William Chirdon. • UL Lafayette's National Incident Management Systems and Advanced Technologies institute (NIMSTAT) and the Civil Air Patrol have partnered with a mission to enhance national resiliency through education, training and operational support for the homeland security and emergency management community. Top University officials were inducted as Civil Air Patrol Members through a special search and rescue exercise and demonstration. • Dr. Vijay Ragavhan, professor of computer science, has collaborated with colleagues at two other universities to develop a new metasearch engine. Large-scale metasearch-engine technology harnesses the power of small search engines to come up with results that are more accurate and complete. • Dr. Mauricio Rodriguez Lanetty won a National Science Foundation (NSF) award for \$386,000 entitled "Exploring the Adaptation and Acclimatization Potentials of Tropical Reef Corals to Global Climate Change." The research will assess the nature of selection imposed by environmental changes and the potential of coral populations to respond to global climate change by evolutionary rapid adaptation. • Graduate students Jana Thoma and Eric Pante traveled with Biology Professor Dr. Scott France to the unexplored waters of the northern Bahamas aboard a research vessel. Dr. France obtained a \$715,500 grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to explore the ocean floor in deep sea submersible vehicles collecting sea life and capturing video. • Dr. Carl Richter of the Geology Department won an award from the Consortium for Ocean Leadership to work as part of a team of 60 scientists to accomplish the goals outlined in the scientific prospectus for Expedition 320.

MAY – AUGUST

Dr. Gary Kinsland of the Geology Department received a grant award to participate in the implementation and development of the Transportable Array (TA) element of USArray project

that is funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF). USArray will consist of a portable array of 400 seismometers that will be deployed across the United States over a 10 year period. • The Manufacturing Extension Partnership of Louisiana (MEPoL) received four national awards during the National Institute of Standards and Technology Manufacturing Extension Partnership National Conference. • Two University professors received awards from the National Science Foundation: Dr. Suzanne Fredericq of the Biology Department won an NSF award entitled *Systematics of the Peyssonneliaceae (Peyssonneliales) — a Family of Crutose Marine Red Algae*; Dr. Danella Zhao, Assistant Professor in Center for Advanced Computer Studies (CACs), was awarded a \$621,000 NSF CAREER award entitled *Wireless Network-on-Chip: A New Communication Paradigm for Heterogeneous Gigascale MPSoC*. The prestigious NSF CAREER award is intended to support junior faculty who exemplify the role of teacher-scholars through outstanding research, excellent education and the integration of education and research. • UL Lafayette alumni, Dr. J. Keith Melancon was in the national spotlight for his part in a 14-patient kidney exchange. It was the largest kidney exchange of its kind to take place in one city, according to a spokesperson at Georgetown University Hospital, where Melancon is Director of Kidney and Pancreas Transplant Surgery.

SEPTEMBER – DECEMBER

NIMSTAT was awarded a \$604,700 grant from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act to create a system that ensures fuel supplies are available to individuals and businesses in times of hurricanes and other emergencies. • Dr. Doug Williams of the Center for Innovative Learning and Assessment Technologies and the College of Education were awarded funds from the National Science Foundation through Texas A&M to continue a project that aims to develop Web-based modules for middle school science. They want to engage students in student-directed inquiry and provide teachers with professional development in facilitating this inquiry. • CPERC (Clean Power and Energy Research Consortium) and a coalition of five Louisiana Universities were awarded a grant from Department of Energy entitled Production and Utilization of Next Generation Fuels for Clean Power. UL Lafayette's participation focused on development of biological production of fuels from agricultural raw-materials. • The University commemorated 50 years of computing and the 25th anniversary of the Center for Advanced Computer Studies. The celebration included the naming of the computer science building in honor and memory of Dr. James Oliver. Oliver taught the University's first computer science class in 1959. A year later, he obtained a grant

from the National Science Foundation to acquire an IBM 1620, the first digital computer used on UL Lafayette's campus. • Researchers with the Center for Advanced Computer Studies have begun to focus on strengthening the nation's cyber infrastructure. UL Lafayette professors will collaborate with other universities and McAfee Labs, a leader in the anti-virus industry. Researchers will develop theoretical models that will aid cyber defenders in predicting the next move of hackers. • UL Lafayette chemical engineering students participated in the American Institute of Chemical Engineers' Chem-E-Car competition sponsored by Chevron. Team members designed and constructed a chemically powered vehicle roughly the size of a shoe box, powered by methanol fuel cells.

The Automated Clearing House (ACH) network was initialized, making automatic bank transfers, also known as electronic funds transfers (EFT), as an added payment option for donors giving to the Alumni Annual Fund. • Keith Guidry joined the staff as Assistant Director, charged with coordinating special events including Spring Gala, Homecoming and leisure travel programs. • Forty-six UL Lafayette faculty and staff who retired in 2008 were honored at the Annual UL Lafayette Retirees luncheon. The Alumni Center co-hosted this event with the UL Lafayette Foundation. • A major improvement was made to the Alumni Center property with the addition of a new parking lot at the rear of the buildings. • UL Lafayette Alumni traveled to Paris, France together over Spring Break. The group, comprised of alumni from as far as North Carolina, toured the City of Lights for eight days. The group toured with other state colleges and universities.

MAY – AUGUST

James Hubert “Red” Dumesnil was honored for his significant impact on the community through his personal and professional life at the 13th annual Spring Gala. The annual event has raised over one million dollars since its inception in 1987. This year Cox Communications made a generous donation of \$10,000 to serve as the Presenting Sponsor of the 2009 Spring Gala. • The Alumni Association named Lan Pham the 2009 Outstanding Spring Graduate. Pham was chosen from eight finalists nominated by the deans of their respective colleges. The Alumni Association Awards Committee gives the award based on leadership, scholarship and service. The eight finalists included: Caroline Randall, Katherine Dallas, Lauren Jankower, Amy Henschke, Elise Peltier, Megan Broussard, Renee Judice, and Lan Pham. • The Alumni Annual Sponsorship program was implemented to help streamline the donor process. The program facilitates better stewardship with University supporters. • Longtime UL Lafayette

Through the sponsorship, the Alumni Association was able to help defray some of the students travel expenses to Washington, D.C. • A week of activities were scheduled for Homecoming including Paint the Town Red for businesses and schools, a tennis tournament, golf tournament, a 5K road race and much more. • The 2009 Outstanding Alumni Awards honored Congressman Charles Boustany, Jr., M.D., Congressman Charlie Melancon and Denis Reggie. • Two new employees joined the staff at the Alumni Center. Holly Leger was named an Assistant Director, charged with coordinating the Alumni Annual Fund, membership and other fundraising initiatives. Jonas Landry joined the staff as an Assistant Director, charged with coordinating the alumni constituent clubs and chapters, organizing reunions and advising the Association of Future Alumni (AFA). • The caretaker’s cottage on the Alumni Center property was totally refurbished as another major improvement to the landmark facility. • The Alumni Association named Michelle Abadie the Fall Outstanding Graduate. Abadie was chosen among seven other finalists, including Mary Ann James, Shawntel Smith, Justin Hernandez, Michelle Noel, Phillip Nevels, Brittany Taylor and Lauren Delcambre. • The Alumni Association served as a co-sponsor of the University Faculty & Staff Christmas Luncheon. JANUARY – APRIL

Tyrell Fenroy was named the 2008 Offensive Player of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association adding to a list of honors that included being named Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. ● The Ragin' Cajuns softball team debuted at No. 6 in the 2009 National Fastpitch Coaches Association preseason softball poll. Pitcher Ashley Brignac was named to the "Watch List" for the 8th annual USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award. ● Football signing day brought 18 young men to the University of Louisiana. National Letters of Intent were received from 14 preparatory and four junior college prospects. ● The Ragin' Cajuns baseball team pulled off an upset win over the third ranked LSU Tigers. The Cajuns had not defeated an opponent ranked so highly since a 3-2 victory over South Carolina in 2000. ● In the 1,300th game of Tony Robichaux's career as a head coach, the Ragin' Cajuns topped UALR 11-1 to notch the baseball program's 700th win at M.L. "Tigue" Moore Field. ● Alexis Green of the women's basketball team was named Third Team 2009 All-Sun Belt Conference. ● A much anticipated Ragin' Cajuns Athletic Foundation was unveiled to meet the immediate and long term goals of the University's Athletic Department. RCAF provides financial support for the 16 intercollegiate varsity teams and its student-athletes. Badeaux attended Teurlings Catholic High School and spent 10 seasons in professional ball at the minor league level. ● JockSmart, a fundraiser for the Ragin' Cajuns Athletic Foundation, was held to benefit student-athletes academically. Several thousand dollars were raised from the golf tournament and forum with featured 2009 Rhodes Scholar and 2010 NFL draft prospect Myron Rolle.

SEPTEMBER – DECEMBER

All three were named to the Carter Plantation Intercollegiate All-Tournament Team. ● Football's Hall Davis accepted an invitation to participate in the 4th Annual Texas vs. the Nation all-star bowl at Sun Bowl Stadium in El Paso, Texas. ● Senior defensive back Phillip Nevels and junior linebacker Grant Fleming were named to ESPN the Magazine's Academic All-America® All-District Team. ● Volleyball's Lindsay Brown reached 500 digs, making her the first player since Gina Calegari in 1997 to reach the mark. ● University of Louisiana student-athletes took part in a bus tour to promote literacy and encourage elementary students to develop a well-balanced lifestyle that includes equal emphasis on academics and physical activity. 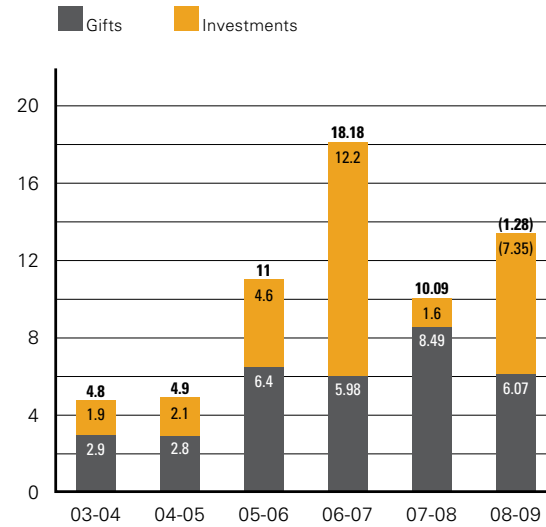

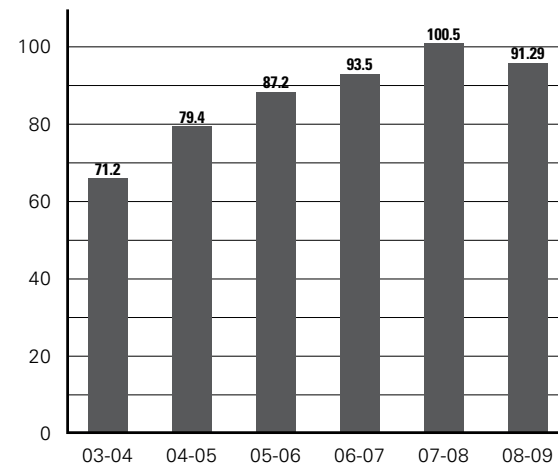

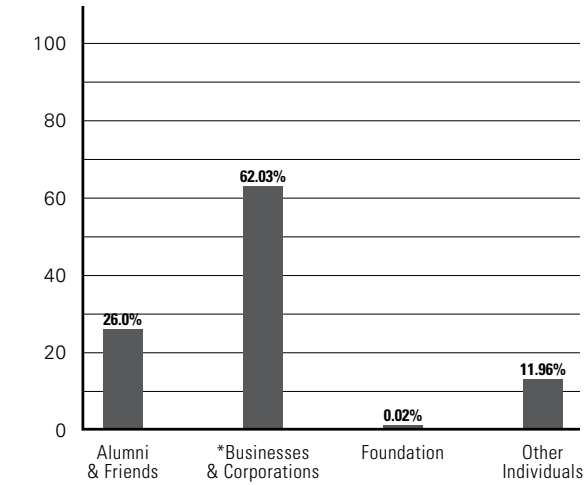
GIFTS AND REALIZED INVESTMENTS (\$MM)



POOLED INVESTMENTS (\$MM)

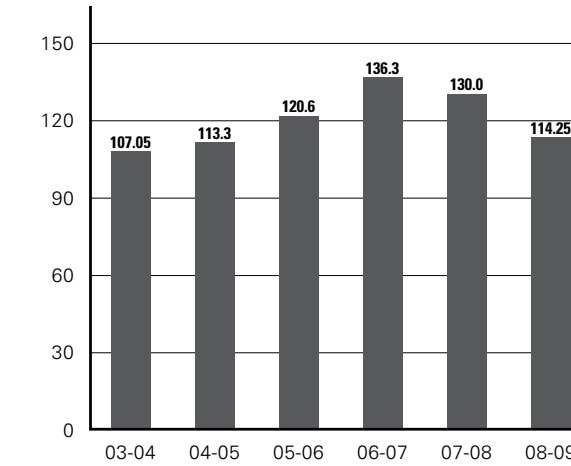


SOURCES OF SUPPORT FY 2008-2009 CASH GIFTS (PERCENTAGES)

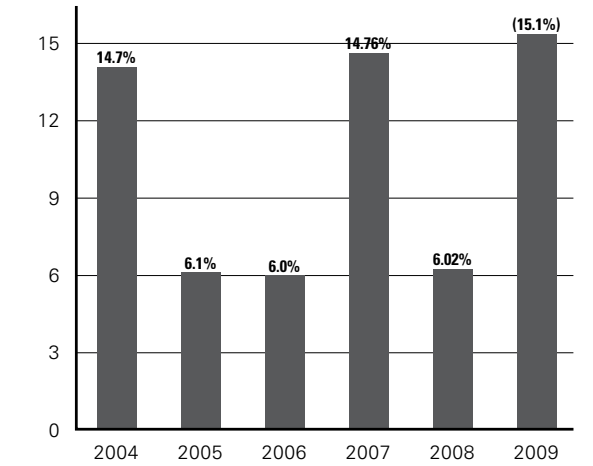

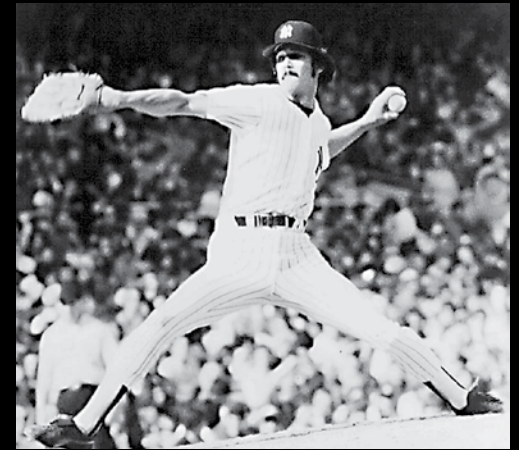
